About SUE-MoT

SUE-MoT is an EPSRC-funded collaboration between the University of Dundee, Loughborough University, Glasgow Caledonian University and the University of St Andrews. The overall vision of the programme is to develop a comprehensive and transparent framework that encourages key decision-makers to systematically assess the sustainability of urban developments taking account of scale, life cycle, location, context and stakeholder values.

The main aim is to promote sustainable development by providing models and toolkits for decision-makers associated with urban development.

Who should attend

Anyone with an interest in urban sustainability and its assessment includ-

ing built environment professionals (such as developers, architects, surveyors, professional advisors, engineers, builders, facilities managers etc., urban planners and designers, urban policy-makers (all levels of government, regulators etc.), urban sustainability assessors, sustainability assessment tool developers, academics, researchers and NGOs.

Venue

The conference will be held at the state-of-the-art facilities at Henry Ford College, situated on the Loughborough University campus.

Accommodation

We have reserved 120 rooms for conference delegates at four local hotels. To take advantage of the block reservation, these must be booked by Sunday 22 March 2009 at the lat-

est. All rates listed here are per night and include breakfast.

Travel

Located in the centre of the country, the Henry Ford College is easily accessible by road, rail and air. It is close to Junction 23 of the M1 and just 10 minutes from East Midlands

airport. Birmingham and its International Airport are easily reached via the M42, with rail links to all parts of the country.

By road from M1 (junction 23) follow A512 east towards Loughborough town centre. Go through two sets of traffic lights and turn right at the first roundabout signposted Loughborough University.

Then take the left turn at the mini roundabout into Henry Ford College.

By road from A6 turn onto A512 (Ashby Road) sign-posted M1. Go straight on at roundabout with Epinal Way and through the traffic lights. Turn left at next roundabout signposted

Loughborough University and left again at the mini roundabout into Henry Ford College.

By rail: 90 minutes from London St Pancras. Approximately 10 minutes by taxi from Loughborough Station. For details of train times, visit www.nationalrail.co.uk.

By air: 8 miles from East Midlands Airport (M1) and convenient for Birmingham Airport (M42).
